Future / Strategic Planning:

The facility is a wonderful addition to the community of Ogallala. We have really promoted the Library Conference Room - that room is used on average 7 times each week with various community groups with over 6,440 total people using the space in the fiscal year 2022/2023. We have had a few off-hour rentals but the bulk of the space has been used for groups holding their regular meetings in the space.

In the Fall of 2023, we were able to install the Svoboda Family Art piece. This piece has been widely talked about in the community. The Art Piece Committee along with the City Council and the Library Foundation plan to do an unveiling event to promote the piece and commemorate the piece and the donation from the family during the year 2024. More to come on this.

As mentioned in previous reports, the biggest concern for the future health of the Library is finding and retaining qualified staff. As we look to building in programming and technology to highlight all the wonderful offerings we have at the library and things we would like to grow we need to understand our staffing limitations and how we can best do more with the staff we have who we have retained.
